

URIDE TERMS OF USE

REVIEW OF DE-IDENTIFIED INFORMATION FOR RESEARCH PREPARATORY PURPOSES

Access to the URIDE system is issued to full-time University of Miami faculty, herein referred to as a User, for the purpose of scientific explorations preparatory to research (prospective and retrospective analysis) and inclusive of research for the purposes of making quality improvement recommendations for the UHealth system. The User hereby agrees to the following terms and conditions for use of the URIDE system:

1. Users access to the requested de-identified clinical information is sought SOLELY for the purpose indicated above.
2. All Users accessing URIDE must complete applicable CITI Human Subjects research training modules and Conflict of Interest forms.
3. User will NOT attempt to identify a particular individual.
4. URIDE currently functions under an IRB-approved protocol where de-identified aggregate EPIC data is made available for research purposes, including research for recommendations on quality improvements for the Health System. Researchers may require more granularity of such data and/or access to additional data containing possible patient identifiers. Such data can be provided on a one-on-one basis, contingent upon:
 - a. The researcher obtaining a specific IRB approval for the study.
 - b. CTSI Biomedical Informatics team developing a specific query to collect the necessary data for the research.
5. User will NOT attempt to copy, modify, sell, distribute, disseminate, or transmit the de-identified clinical information.
6. User will not share his/her personal credentials that granted him/her access to the URIDE de-identified clinical information.
7. In case of need, a Faculty member may request special access for a post-doctoral fellow or a resident. In such a case, the requesting Faculty member will be held accountable for compliance with URIDE policy. Such a request requires:
 - a. Formal justification.
 - b. Department Chair approval.

All other employees are not allowed access to URIDE (such as clinical research coordinators).

8. A Quality Steering Committee will review any research products derived from URIDE data before its dissemination. The charge of the committee will be to guarantee the quality of data, conclusions, or recommendations. The User agrees that any research product (including but not limited to presentations, grant submissions, abstracts, and publications) derived from URIDE data will be submitted for review by the URIDE Quality Steering Committee before submission/dissemination.
9. Users must seek biostatistics and database development support, provided through the Miami Clinical and Translational Science Institute Biostatistics and Study Design Program, prior to submitting a research product to the Quality Steering Committee. This provision is intended to help Users avoid study design and biostatistical errors in the interpretation of URIDE data.

10. URIDE Users commit to acknowledging the Miami CTSI and the CTSI Biostatistics and Study Design Program when disseminating findings from URIDE data. The Miami CTSI will provide appropriate language. Guidelines for authorship credit will follow NIH recommendations, which are elucidated in the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals, developed by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors ([Click here](#)).

11. URIDE Users agree to adhere to the NIH's public access policy, found [here](#).

12. URIDE Users must provide an annual report on outcomes, or lack thereof, resulting from their URIDE queries. This provision is intended to:

a. Provide feedback to the CTSI Biomedical Informatics team for enhancement of URIDE capabilities and usability.

b. Allow for the Miami CTSI to report on the impact of URIDE on research conducted at the University of Miami.

13. User will NOT translate, reverse engineer, decompile or disassemble the Software, or disclose the Software or any underlying information or technology to any third party.

14. The University of Miami shall have the sole discretion to grant, restrict or terminate Users access to the URIDE system at any time and for any reason.

15. All URIDE data, logos, trademarks and service marks are the property of the University of Miami. Nothing on URIDE should be construed as granting any license or right to use any trademark, service mark, or logo displayed on this Site without the express permission of the University of Miami or the third party that may own the trademark, service mark or logo.
